The majority of us can remember what we were doing last Saturday at 4:00 p.m. If we think for a minute, we can probably recall the Saturday before that. In contrast, go back a few months, and most of us will have trouble remembering. We usually can't remember what we were doing at a specific time on a specific day. Those of us with average memories simply forget these details. And this is normal. We remember what we need and what we think is important. The ( 1 ), we forget.

(2)This is not the case, however, for a few people with extraordinary memories. AJ from California is one of these people. She remembers every single detail of last Saturday, and the Saturday before that. In fact, she remembers every detail of almost every day of her life since age 11. She remembers that at 12:34 p.m. on Sunday, August 3, 1986, a young man called her on the telephone. What was she doing at noon, March 28, 1992? She was having lunch with her father in the Beverly Hills Hotel. "My memory flows like a movie—nonstop and uncontrollable," she explains.

AJ was in seventh grade when she first realized that her memory was unusual. "I was not happy because I hated school.  I started thinking about the year before....  But then I started realizing that I was remembering the exact date and exactly what I was doing a year ago that day."  As she grew older, her unique ability continued to develop.  Today, she might have one of the best memories in the world.

Researchers have studied AJ for many years. They are coming up with some interesting findings. AJ can recall personal events on any day in the last 35 years. ( 3 ), researchers found that she doesn't score very well on standard memory tests. She has difficulty remembering a series of numbers, for example. So her amazing memory only relates to her own life. For this reason, (4)scientists call her memory autobiographical. Only a handful of people worldwide have this type of memory.

These people have two interesting things in common. First, parts of their (5){A. average memory B. brains C. different from D. of a person E. are physically F. the brain G. with }. For example, the nerve connections between the middle and front of the brain are stronger. Equally important, people like AJ can't stop thinking about the past. They keep diaries. They read old newspapers. In other words, they work hard to remember the past. These two factors are beginning to shed light on autobiographical memory.

Remembering everything has its advantages. Yet it can also be very stressful. "I remember good [things], which is very comforting. But I also remember bad [things]—and

every bad choice,” AJ explains. “And I don’t give myself a ( 6 )... I am still beating myself up over them.” She concludes, “Most people have called what I have a gift, but (7)I call it a burden.”
