When she looked around her house, Susan Maushart saw lots of electronics. Along with the usual things like the television and stereo, she had her own laptop and smart phone. Plus there were all of her kid's electronic devices: cell phones, video game devices, mp4 players, and more! There seemed to be more than enough ways for her and her three children to plug in and be online all day, every day.

( 1 ) most parents who can remember a time before so much technology was available, Ms. Maushart worried that her kids were becoming too dependent on the Internet and electronics. Then she began to reread one of her favorite books, ②Henry Thoreau's *Walden*. Thoreau's experience of living in a simple cabin gave Ms. Maushart an idea. Thoreau spent 2 years in the cabin without running water, and having to grow his own food. Maybe she and her family could live without such luxuries as computers and electronic devices for a while.

Ms. Maushart talked with her kids and explained that ③ { A. family B. living C. she D. the E. to F. try G. wanted } for 6 months without the Internet, cell phones, TV, and video games. Ms. Maushart writes articles for a newspaper in Australia, and she has written several books as well. She told her children that if they agreed, she would write a book about their experience and she would share the money from sales of the book with them. Her three children agreed, and "the experiment," as Ms. Maushart called it, began.

In order to kick ( 4 ) the experiment in style, Ms. Maushart took drastic measures. She turned ( 4 ) all of the electricity in the house and they lived without power for a few weeks. This meant no lights and no hot water. They all used candles, took cold showers, and kept their food in a cooler of ice for those first few weeks. Ms. Maushart hoped that taking such a drastic measure would help the kids as they would ( 5 ) the Internet and video games less when she turned the electricity back on.

Over the course of the experiment, the Maushart children had different reactions to life without electronics. Before the experiment began, Anni, the eldest of the children, read books more than her younger brother and sister. ⑥She therefore had a relatively easy adjustment to the family's new lifestyle. Anni could also use the library's computer for her homework. Bill, who loved to play video games before the experiment began, had to find a way to spend all of his new free time. He started practicing his saxophone more and ended up developing a serious interest in music. Sussy, the youngest child in the family, had the hardest time

adjusting to life without electronics. In fact, for 6 weeks of the experiment, she chose to move in with her father — her mother and father were divorced, but they both still lived in Perth, Australia.

The family carried on with the experiment for the 6 months without technology controlling their lives, and Ms. Maushart believes they all came out better for the experience. The children had a lot more interaction with each other and with their mother. They could not text other, they had to actually see each other and talk. The family played board games together. They cooked meals together. They read the newspaper together and each of them read a lot more books. In Sussy's case in particular, she improved her grades in school.

Ms. Maushart wrote the book she had planned. In her book and in interviews about the book, Ms. Maushart explains that she understands that this kind of experiment is not for everyone. For those who want to try, she recommends setting aside special "screen-free days" where ~~(7)~~families unplug themselves and spend time together. And in cases where parents think their children might fight the idea, Ms. Maushart's advice to parents is, "~~(8)~~You can always lie. Just tell the kids the Wi-Fi is down."
